# News from the Principal

Hello Craigieburn Community,

I hope you are well and keeping safe.

The news of the extension to lockdown in metropolitan Melbourne is certainly not what we were hoping for, but the health, safety and wellbeing of our community is paramount.

As the lockdown period for Melbourne has been extended by a further 7 days, remote learning will therefore remain during this time, with school resuming onsite for everyone on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> August.

Our teachers will continue with our remote learning program this will include WebEx catch-ups and 'live' learning lessons will occur at the same time as they have for this week. There will also be small focus **teaching groups operating via WebEx and your child's class teacher will notify you of this.**

**Onsite supervision will continue for those students who are currently eligible, as per the Department's** criteria below:

- ◆ Children where both parents are authorised workers who cannot work from home
- ◆ Where there are two parents, both must be essential workers, working outside the home in order for their children to be eligible for on-site provision.
- ◆ For single parent, the essential worker must be working outside the home in order for their children to be eligible for on-site provision.
- ◆ Children in out-of-home care
- ◆ Children deemed vulnerable by a government agency or family violence service, and assessed as requiring education and care outside the family home and students with a disability enrolled in mainstream schools.

If you require on-site supervision and meet the above criteria, complete and submit the attached attendance application. Please indicate the days you require on-site attendance for your child/ren during this lock-down period and submit your application to the school email address [craigieburn.ps@education.vic.gov.au](mailto:craigieburn.ps@education.vic.gov.au) by no later than 5pm Friday 13<sup>th</sup> August.

All successful attendance applications will receive a confirmation email from the school.


### 2021 PARENT / CAREGIVER / GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY

**WE WANT OUR PARENTS / CAREGIVERS / GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!**

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and **Training. It is designed to assist schools in understanding families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning.** Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All responses to the survey are anonymous. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July to Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> August. Families have been emailed the survey link and code. So far, 50 people have already provided their feedback.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any time until the closing date on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Hindi, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.







## 2022 ENROLMENTS

Enrolments for 2022 Prep Students are now open.

Due to the current circumstances Enrolment Forms will need to be downloaded from the school website, filled in and returned to the school email address.

As we are unable to hold School Tours at the moment we would like to let you know that there is a virtual tour for you to view on the school website.

If you are unable to download the enrolment form you can collect this from the office.

**You will need to include a copy of your child's Birth Certificate and Immunisation Certificate with the completed Enrolment Form.** The school is unable to process the enrolment until we have copies of these documents.

Our school has an Enrolment Ceiling (put in place by the Department of Education) to keep numbers within the capacity of the school site. We have been asked to try and limit Prep enrolments for 2022 to 90 children. This can be extended if the number of children wishing to enrol from our local zone exceeds this number.

- ◆ All children in our area as per the Find My School website — <https://www.findmyschool.vic.gov.au> - *Please select the 2022 map.*

The zone encompasses all residences in Craigieburn where Craigieburn Primary is the closest school. It also includes some residents who live on the right side of the Hume Freeway going north to Kalkallo.

- ◆ Siblings of children attending our school (as long as this is done prior to the 1st of September)
- ◆ Children from outside our zone if we have less than 90 enrolments at the beginning of September.

It is important that you enrol your 2022 Prep students as soon as possible.

# Curriculum News

## REMOTE LEARNING

Melbourne is again in lockdown and it is day by day. Teachers, parents and students are working together to maintain student learning through these challenging times, as we help to support our community stay safe.

Last week, teachers were planning, meeting with students in WebEx meetings and contacting parents to assist all enquiries. This helps to ensure a smooth transition to our online learning.

Online delivery provides more opportunities for students, but for families who are unable to engage in **online learning, hard copy work packs are available in the foyer of the school. Recording your child's** name and grade on the sheets provided, enables the teacher to mark their attendance, and that work can be handed to the teacher for feedback when we return onsite. Education is a permitted reason to leave home, so you are able to visit the school to collect this work for your child.

After the first week of lockdown the school enters our Phase 3 of remote learning delivery. Teachers will run small group teaching sessions, so every child has the opportunity to be involved once every week. Children will now submit two classroom learning tasks each week through Compass and teachers will provide feedback to students on those submissions. Specialist teachers will also provide additional learning tasks that can be submitted through Compass. The tasks to submit will be identified on Compass.

Whole grade WebEx meetings, continue to be conducted daily and are scheduled at the following times:

- ◆ Prep, Grade 5 and 6 - 9:15 to 9:45 am
- ◆ Grade 3 and 4 - 9:45 to 10:15 am
- ◆ Grade 1 and 2 - 10:15 to 10:45 am

This enables teachers to mark the roll and identify absences to follow up. Participation in the meeting provides an opportunity for children to see their friends and teachers. This is important for wellbeing, as your child is also feeling the effects of isolation. During the meeting, there is an opportunity to clarify the work required, so students and parents please ask questions. Teachers can be emailed directly through Compass, or can call you to discuss concerns. Please note, when working from home teachers calling you will show as an unknown number. Please answer, we are not those annoying marketing calls, and classroom teachers will only communicate with parents or check in during school hours from 8.30am - 4pm

Establishing a daily routine with your children at home is very important, but will need to be adjusted to **meet the context of each family's individual circumstances.** Please reinforce the importance of continuing **to work at home, as you adjust and care for your child's wellbeing. Sometimes a short play outside or walk** to the park is needed. Daily schedules are posted on Compass, inclusive of the weekly tasks to allow for a self-paced learning program and to provide flexibility to families.





## BOOK WEEK

**This term, we celebrate Book Week and the theme is 'Old Worlds, New Worlds, Other Worlds'. This National event celebrates books by Australian authors and illustrators, to highlight the importance of reading and is celebrated by many schools and public libraries. The CBCA (Children's Book Council of Australia) is currently judging the book of the year awards.**

Our CPS character parade is scheduled for Friday 27th August.

We are hoping to be onsite, but will dress up and run our day remotely if needed.



## STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics)

STEM is a fun and engaging program that incorporates Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. The **STEM program at CPS has a strong focus on engineering. Students participate in a 'getting to know you' activity, two projects and then move into coding.** This year STEM lessons introduced some basic skills lessons to develop basic material modification and joining skills.

**The 'getting to know you' activity allows students to get a feel for STEM and some of the expectations, as well as an opportunity for the teacher to get to know the students a little better and develops teamwork.**

Each of the projects follows the Engineering design process. This allows for an investigation, design and procedure phase, a creating phase and a test, improve and reflect phase. Each of the projects in every year level takes 4 weeks (or 4 x 1-hour sessions). The creating phase is 2 weeks.

STEM projects use everyday materials, with an emphasis on sustainable or recyclable materials, teamwork and a collaborative approach to the work where everyone is included.

Coding is an amazing tool to learn. We have been fortunate enough to incorporate this into our STEM program. All students at CPS have a unique class code and individual passwords. Each student will have access to Code.org, a safe and easy to use coding platform that is free to our school. This year we are hoping that we can utilise our robots (Spheros and Bee Bots) as a complement to our coding lessons.



## NAPLAN 2022

The school is currently participating in training and technical readiness checks in anticipation of NAPLAN testing moving online in 2022. This would provide results to school and parents sooner, as the Department of Education and Training work to improve this process.

## Capacity- Prep



In Maths the Preps have been learning all about capacity.

## Speedy Sorting

Maths Skills: Place value

Number of players: 2+



### Set-up:

Remove Jokers. Aces count as 1s, Jacks as 11s, Queens as 12s and Kings as 13s. Deal five cards face down to each player.

### To play:

Simultaneously, players turn their cards over and race to put them in order from the highest value to the lowest.

Eg: Queen, ten, three, Ace.
